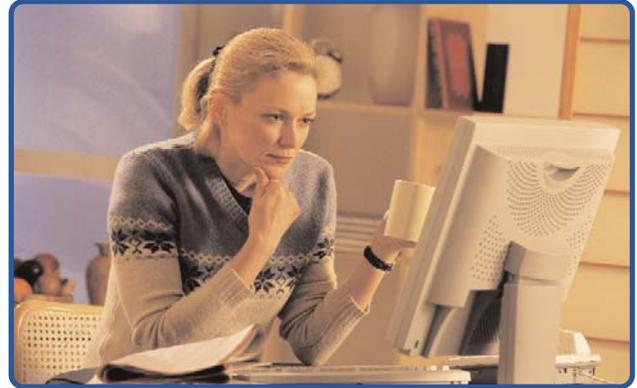
When is an email better than a letter?
